CARTER LORENZO DEAS age 74, of Monroeville, Pennsylvania died April 5, 2010 at the Western Pennsylvania Hospital - Forbes Campus in Monroeville, Pennsylvania.

Carter was born December 13, 1935 in Charleston, South Carolina. He was the son of the late Carter C. and Viola B. Deas.

Carter joined Calvary Baptist Church at an early age and continued to worship there until he entered the U. S. Army.
