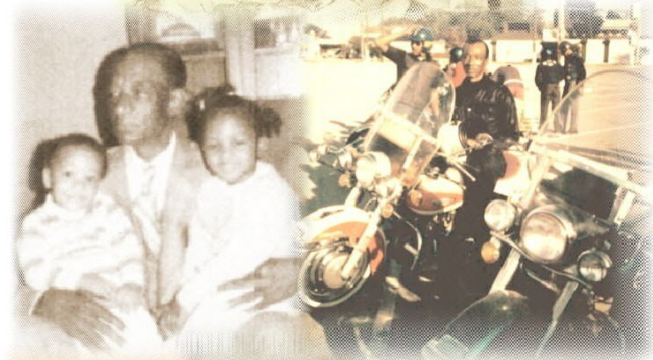

Clarence would always quote John 3:3, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again".

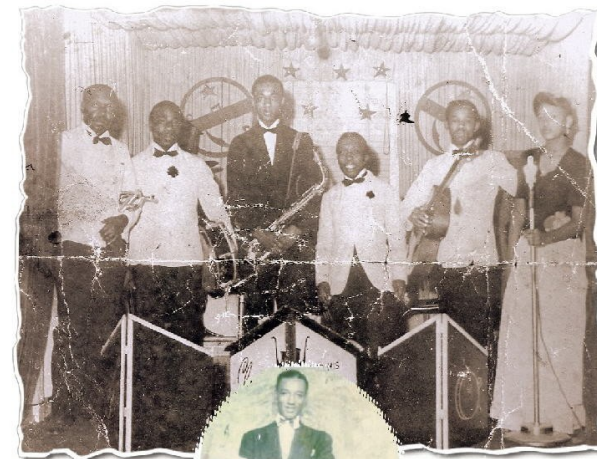

He joined Morris Street Baptist Church as a young boy. Clarence married Mamie Brooks and to this union Portia, Clarence, Jr. "Syi", and Jacob were born. They preceded him in death. He later married Mindell Smith in Bermuda and to this union two children, Yolanda and Carlton were born.

He began his career in the funeral profession with his father at J. B. Moultrie Funeral Home. He divided his time and energy between the funerals and music. He loved music and organized The Swing Serenaders Band. Not only did he play the saxophone but wrote the music to some of his songs. He entertained all over South Carolina and sometimes traveled the east coast with the fair playing in the minstrel bands. In the late 30's and early 40's Clarence pitched for the local baseball teams, Charleston Stars, Charleston Piedmont and Charleston Crusaders. He also enjoyed riding his Harley Davidson motorcycle. He would take Mindell on Sunday evening rides in the countryside.

Clarence also enjoyed writing different Bible scriptures and posting them on the walls of his room at Mt Pleasant Manor. He would draw reference to these when family and friends visited.
