Mr. Oscar Pearson, a devoutly, kind, gentle and courageous Christian gentleman, answered the Master's call on Saturday, December 11, 2010 at Ralph H. Johnson Veterans Administration Hospital.

Mr. Pearson was born October 26, 1918 in Lugoff, Kershaw County, South Carolina. He was the son of the late Mr. Preston Pearson and the late Mrs. Viola Edwards Rivers. He was reared by his grandmother, Mrs. Janie Edwards Snipe and aunt, Mrs. Katherine Edwards Kinloch in Charleston, South Carolina.

Mr. Pearson attended Charleston County Public Schools. As a child, he attended Morris Brown AME church with his grandmother and aunt. He faithfully served his country in the United States Army for 1941-1945. While still in the military, he was united in Holy matrimony to the late Miss Florence Toomer.

After serving his country, Mr. Pearson moved to New York City NY where he worked at the Americana Hotel for many years. Upon returning to Charleston, he worked as a long shore man at the Charleston waterfront. He reunited himself to his church, Morris Brown AME, where he served on the Usher Board.

Mr. Pearson joined the Boaz Lodge and became a Master Mason on October 10, 1983. He worked for his church and served faithfully until his health failed. To know him was to love him.
