**Richard Allen Scott** was born February 4, 1936 in Charleston, South Carolina. He is the son of the late Mattie Scott Washington and Ernest Washington. He left this world quietly on Monday, January 10, 2011.

**Richard Allen** graduated from the first graduating class of Baptist Hill High School in May 1953. He attended the church in the local community until he left home at a young age and joined the Army. Upon discharge from the Army, he moved to New York. He was employed as a Mechanic Helper with the New York City Transit Authority in 1968 and moved the ranks and retired as Field Supervisor in May 1991.

**Richard Allen** joined the US Army National Guard in 1976 and retired February 4, 1996. Awards received include: Army Service Ribbon, NYS Long and Faithful Medal (15) years, Armed Forces Reserve Medal (10) years, Army Reserve Achievement Medal NYS Commendation Medal.
